

Over forthcoming editions I shall be taking a look at new issues from around the world, both recently issued and those due for release.

There is an abundance of new issues these days and some pure philatelists do not rate what they call jam pot labels. However, you cannot get away from the fact that there are millions of collectors around the world who enjoy some of the colourful stamps produced, many combine their collecting with other interests such as bird watching or trains and have thematic as well as country collections.

Our hobby is there to enjoy and we should all collect whatever we get enjoyment from.

This years "Europa" theme is Tales & Legends and many countries are due to release stamps on the subject. Fans of horror will no doubt have enjoyed the 4 spooky stamps which our own Post Office issued on 13th They celebrated Bram May. Stoker's Dracula, Mary Shelley's Frankenstein, Robert Louis Stevenson's Dr Jekyll and Mr Hyde, Arthur Conan Doyle's Hound of the Baskervilles.

Other countries participating include Guernsey, Jersey, Croatia, Slovakia and a host of others too numerous to mention here.

8 July Great Britain - Horses. 50th Anniversary of the British Horse Society.

6 August
New Zealand - Scenic Trains (6 vals). The train collectors amongst you may be disappointed, as they are more scenic than trains.

What is going on in Hong Kong?

At the Hong Kong '97 stamp show recently the Hong Kong Post Office was reported to have the equivalent taken of £50,000,000 on current new issues at face value. The Post Office there had to leave it's booths open until midnight on the opening day and security staff had to persuade collectors to go home. There were even 17,000 people queuing up outside the door before the Exhibition was open. I bet you thought that the British Post Office was raking in the money from collectors, didn't you?

There is a lot of speculation in the stamps of Hong Kong at the moment and buying prices are very high. The same appears to be developing in the stamps of Macau.

In the next edition I anticipate previewing some of this year's Christmas issues, the earliest of which I think is 3 September. Is it me getting older or does Christmas seem to get earlier every year?
