

Philatelic Museums and Libraries

Museums provide a wealth of material for anyone wishing to carry out research, postal museums are no exception. In this article I have listed some of the major sources for philatelic research in this country. Many are open to the public and well worth a visit if you are in the area.

Bath

Bath Postal Museum, 8 Broad Street, Bath BA1 5LJ

Opening times: 11.00-17.00 Monday to Saturday, 14.00-17.00 Sunday.

Situated in a former Post Office the museum celebrates Ralph Allen and Bath postal history. Extending over three stories the displays cover the Penny Black, airmails, special exhibitions and replica Victorian Post Office.

Colne

British in India Museum, Sun Street, Colne, Lancashire BB8 0JJ Postal history and airmails from the period of British rule in India.

Huddersfield

Tolson Museum Ravensknowle Park, Wakefield Road, Huddersfield HD5 8DJ Reputed to contain an "old time" whole world collection.

Llangollen

Local postal history, artefacts and replica Victorian Post Office.

Leeds

Roebuck Stamp Collection, Brotherton Library, University of Leeds, Leeds LS2 9JT

Viewing by appointment. The Denison Roebuck collection, of mainly GB Victorian stamps, was presented to Leeds University in 1913. It has not been remounted and is arranged on approximately 50 racks held in a strong room.

World Class Collections. 6000 sheets on permanent display. Originally based on the superb material in the Tapling Collection - the only major whole world 19th collection still in existence it includes Cape Triangulars; Gold Coast 1883 (May) 1d on 4d; Great Britain 1858-79 1d Red Plate 77 unused; Hawaii 1851-52 2c to 13c (both types) ~ the "Missionaries"; India 1854 4a error ~ head inverted, two copies used on cover; Mauritius 1847 1d, used on cover, 2d unused ~ The "Post Office" issue; Western Australia 1854 4d error used ~ frame inverted. Other collections on display include Chinchen (Lundy Island), Fitzgerald (Airmails including USA 1924 24c red & blue inverted centre bi-plane ~ "inverted jenny", Model (Germany (1945-1946) and Moseley (British Africa to 1935).

Many other specialised collections (including the Fletcher collection formerly at Bruce Castle) and archive material available to serious researchers. Backed by professional staff with the resources of the British Library (access restricted) which contains virtually all British copyright printed material including philatelic literature (and the Crawford Library).

Show place for permanent display of the magnificent R M Phillips Collection of the British Postage Stamps of the 19th Century. Assembled privately between approximately 1940 and 1965. Contains all major proofs, essays, trails and issued stamps and varieties. Mind blowing, if you can find it Stanley Gibbons GB specialised catalogue you will also find it here. Also houses Frank Staff GB postal history collection from 1661, the British Post Office UPU collection and various PO artefacts. By appointment it is also possible to see the surviving GB Queen Victoria Line-Engraved imprimatur sheets and De La Rue printing records.

British Post Office records from 17th century to the present day. Published and unpublished material covering Post Office administration, development of Postal services including stamps, broadcasting, Savings Bank and distribution of the mail.

Royal Collection, Buckingham Palace, London SW1

World Class Collection but sadly *not* open to the public. Based on the superb collection of GB and British Commonwealth stamps, proofs, essays etc. formed by HM George V. Contains many unique items obtained with the help of postal authorities or taken from the PO archives. No authoritative statement on ownership seems to have been issued and the collection may be either the personal property of HM The Queen or the property of the Crown. Items are on occasion lent for display at major events but the last exhibition of the collection to the public was in 1965. There is a "catalogue" The Royal Philatelic Collection written by Sir John Wilson (1952), weighing several kilograms and long out of print it can be found in many philatelic and UK public libraries and provides details on thousands of items.
