MEETING REPORTS by "Fly On The Wall"

3 July: Letters G, H, I (Members).

Five members brought displays on this occasion. Gary Green started with "Italy" and "Iceland", followed by Ian Hunt with thematic issues of "Hungary". Maggie Thompson was next, showing the "Halle" postmaster provisionals of August 1923 in Germany. All eight types were shown mint and on cover.

After the break, Alf Potter showed "Infantry Soldiers" of the USA 1775 to 1985 on postcards. Len Stanway completed the evening with "Hungary 1868-1932", a collection that he rarely shows.

18 July: Grenada (Andy Soutar).

Andy Soutar, from Ipswich, brought a fascinating display of the stamps and postal stationery of Grenada, a West Indian island that your writer has never seen displayed before. Starting with the use of a British stamp and postmark used in Grenada, he took us through all the early issues, displaying many rarities, including Specimens and at least one "Before Hardening" developmental die proof. Unusual items included postal stationery from Perkins Bacon and a Size I registration envelope. After the break, he extended his display to the middle of the 20th Century, after which the Chairman gave him a well-deserved vote of thanks.

7 August: German Occupation of the Channel Islands (Alan Moorcroft).

Alan returned to give us a hybrid digital and onframe presentation on a subject for which he is clearly very passionate. He began with the strange affairs of 1940, when Guernsey was already evacuating school children, yet, until the fall of France, Jersey was being promoted as a place for beleaguered Britons to take summer holidays! He then took us through the events of the occupation from both social and philatelic perspectives with the experiences of some individuals caught up in the events. Coverage of stamps and postal history included revenue stamps and we were warned about the dangerous forgeries that exist of most of the stamps and essays of the period. Alan was accompanied by his wife and grandson and Charlie Mead thanked them all for coming and giving us a very memorable and enlightening evening.

22 August: My Favourite Theme (Members).

We welcomed a potential new member to the society. Alf Potter started proceedings with a selection of Victorian-era postcards designed for use as greetings cards for birthdays, etc. Maggie Thompson followed on with her "Pussy Cats", showing lions, tigers, leopards, cheetahs, ocelot, etc., on stamps and postal stationery. At the end, "confused cats" included a Puma helicopter and a Jaguar car.

Round two started with Lynn Roberts, who brought some of the Lighthouses and Ships collected by her late husband. She was followed

by Ian McElwain showing War Tax from a wide variety of countries.

The last round was given by Len Stanway, who showed a small selection from his World of Railways collection, including The Whyte Arrangement and Preservation.

4 September: British Honduras (Andrew Skilling).

Andrew travelled down from Frinton to show a recently-started collection of this rarely-displayed country. He started off with pre-stamp material, then took us through Victorian and early 20th Century material up to the early days of Queen Elizabeth II, showing, where possible, mint and Specimen stamps, plus first day or other covers. In the second round, he completed new issues to Independence, plus a range of village postmarks. As if this amazing display was not enough, he completed the evening with some of his Harwich Ship Letter mail, including a reused wrapper that had been shipwrecked on the first lap of its travels!

19 September: Railway Art and Railways (Colin Evans).

Colin started with a display of railway and tram art on postcards, posters, stamps, etc., by the late Terence Cuneo and a wide variety of other artists. Round two was devoted to Stephenson's Rocket for the Liverpool and Manchester Railway, the Rainhill Trials, etc. The final round covered a wide range of other railways, including modern traction such as the Advanced Passenger Train.

The famous One Cent Magenta will be on show on the Stanley Gibbons stand during Stampex.
