International News

OVERSEAS EXHIBITING

More-advanced collectors (some of whom are members of this society) enjoy exhibiting items from their collections abroad. International exhibitions are once again in full swing. Overseas exhibitions fall into three categories:

- 1. National and private exhibitions that choose to invite overseas entrants. These set their own entry and judging criteria.
- 2. Continental federation exhibitions are organised by the international federation responsible for that region. In Europe that is FEPA (European Federation of Philatelic Associations), in Asia-Pacific FIAP, etc. These set their own entry criteria, but generally judge to FIP rules.
- 3. Full international and world exhibitions that invite entries world-wide, organised by a national organising committee under the auspices of the International Philatelic Federation (FIP).

Unless otherwise decided by the organisers, to be eligible for five frames at a FIP, FEPA or other overseas Federation competition, UK collectors must first reach qualifying standard (75 points and vermeil medal) in an ABPS national exhibition.

Entries must be made through the UK Commissioner for the event, appointed by ABPS.

Potential exhibitors should consult the ABPS website for details of forthcoming national and international exhibitions that they might enter.

MEETING REPORTS by "Fly On The Wall"

Chelmsford & District P.S. meeting held on 11 October. Report by David Everard (CDPS)

We were pleased to welcome members of Basildon Philatelic Society to our meeting. The evening comprised two presentations covering islands on opposite sides of the globe. First up was Ian McElwain, who is also a member of our Society. He chose Malta and presented material from the earliest stamps up to the 1940s and included handstamps, postage stamps with various watermarks, postage rates, airmail from 1928 as well as postcards. After a refreshment interval Charlie Mead presented a display on Fiji covering the reigns of Edward VII and George V used in this remote island group. As well as standard "Key Types" with numerous values and colour combinations, his display also included a forgery of a £1 stamp, postage due stamps, stationery, newspaper wrappers, postcards and letter cards. He also gave details of Tin Can Post to Tonga Pat Adams from the chair thanked both gentlemen for a very informative and interesting evening. 18 October - War Tax - Geoff Miller



Geoff, from Frinton, made a welcome return to display these stamps, issued by various colonies to raise funds for the war effort in both World Wars.

7 November - Letters D, E or F - members' displays

Five members provided displays. Claude Crowder opened the evening by showing DOMINICA and then followed with CINDERELLA material from the Spanish CIVIL WAR (Claude thought it was C, D or E). It was decided that the civil war had been a DISPUTE and was therefore on topic. Maggie Thompson started the second round with postage DUE stamps from FRENCH colonies including colour trials and ESSAYS. Charlie Mead followed with FIJI from the reign of EDWARD VII including a modern FORGERY of the 1912 £1 value (a stamp that had been issued after the King's death in 1910). Harry Flatman finished the session with a £2 Machin D1 cylinder block showing the missing pound sign flaw. For the final session, Alf Potter showed postcards depicting postal DELIVERY in its many different forms. All participants were presented with a certificate of appreciation.
